## **MULTIFAMILY ALL-ELECTRIC CONSTRUCTION INCENTIVE PROGRAM**







The California Electric Homes Program (CalEHP) provides technical assistance and financial incentives to residential developers and builders constructing new, market-rate homes with all-electric appliances and equipment. The program supports all-electric new construction practices, energy storage, and supports California’s advanced energy efficiency policy goals.

### **Eligibility**

Any market rate all-electric new construction multifamily low-rise, high-rise, or condominium located in California is eligible for incentives and bonuses for above-code and energy storage measures.

### **Prerequisites**

The Electric Homes program requires all participating projects to have 100% all-electric residential spaces, including residential common areas. The program requires participating multifamily projects to install:

 Heat Pump Space Heating	 Heat Pump Water Heating	 Induction Cooking <sup>1</sup>
 Thermostatic Mixing Valve	 Segregated Circuit	 Communicating Thermostat <sup>2</sup>

### **Multifamily**

- Low-rise
- High-rise
- Condominiums

### **Participation Requirements:**

- Install minimum program prerequisites
- Not be Deed restricted
- Submit Title 24 (T24) energy models, approved permit, architectural, and MEP plans
- Adhere to all applicable federal, state, and local laws and codes

<sup>2</sup> Not required for properties installing variable capacity heat pumps (VCHP)

# Multifamily Base Incentives

California Electric Homes will coordinate with other all-electric new construction programs to maximize incentives for all-electric construction in California with exceptions for projects in all-electric reach code jurisdictions.

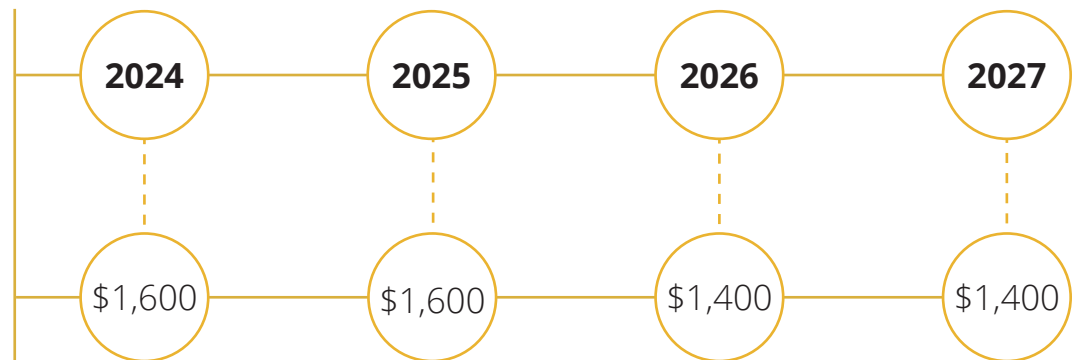
# Energy Storage Incentives

- \$250/kWh for storage
- \$300/kWh for storage in all-electric reach code jurisdictions



## Incentive Levels per Participating Market Rate Dwelling Unit

Multifamily Apartments and Condominiums



**NOTE:** Multifamily and condominium units located in a disadvantaged community (DAC) or hard-to-reach (HTR) community are eligible for an additional \$350 per dwelling unit.

Projects enrolling before 12/31/24 can request a waiver for the induction cooking requirement. Incentives will be reduced by \$500 for each multifamily unit using the exception.



Bonus incentives for heat pump pool heaters and above code envelope, mechanical, and load management measures are available on the website.
